My dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

It is my pleasure and honour to bring you greetings on behalf of the Board of Trustees of the global Mothers' Union and our central headquarters staff at Mary Sumner House. We are in the season of Lent and as I write to you, we are moving forward to the celebration of Easter. I often say that this is indeed a 'bright sad' season of Lent.

We walk with Jesus in the wilderness, we walk with him as he takes his cross, as he falls, as he meets his mother, and as Simon and Veronica help him. Jesus consoles the women and falls several more times. He is stripped, he is crucified and he dies on the cross. He is taken down and buried. Jesus' resurrection is about new beginnings. God gives us a new dawn, a new creation, and a renewed purpose. As we mark our 150th Anniversary, we step into a new season not just because we are strong, but because Christ is risen and goes before us. He not only goes before us, but he walks with us and at times he carries us.

In 1 Corinthians 15:58 we are reminded to *stand firm and let nothing move us...to give ourselves fully to the work of the Lord, for our labor in the Lord is not in vain.*



We are a Kingdom people of hope. We can do all things through Christ who strengthens us. We are stronger together. We are the 'mighty Mothers' Union' to quote Archbishop Stephen Cotrell, and we have served our Heavenly Father for 150 years.
